

Ensemble Camp - Intermediate (9-11 years)

Experienced students coming to enrich ensemble skills

Aim: This course aims to support Band Instrument (Woodwind, Brass and Percussion) musicians to enrich their performance and ensemble skills alongside developing instrumental music learning strategies and personal skills.

Prerequisites:

Students in this program should display intermediate skills on a Band instrument. Typically at least one year of school experience or studying with a private tutor.

Learning Expectations:

- Engage in teamwork and cooperation by working together to create and perform ensemble Instrumental music.
- Refine listening, visual and aural literacy, increase technical skills and interpretation of ensemble music.
- Develop and extend personal skills, habits, and processes for success in learning music.
- Strengthen social skills and personal expression, and develop friendships, by working as a team in ensemble playing.

Course information:

The course will be delivered as a Concert Band <u>or</u> Chamber Group experience according to student numbers, instrumentation and experience. The Content focus is similar for both ensembles, with repertoire selection based on participant's musical skills and instrumentation.

Content:

- Performance Skill development, as identified. (Scales, exercises or technique building repertoire).
- Ensemble Skill development, as identified in Band or Chamber music settings. (Tone, Tuning, Technique, Balance, Rhythm, Dynamics, Articulation and Expression in repertoire).

Schedule:

Day 1 to 4 - Group ensemble instruction on selected repertoire and curated ensemble exercises.



Day 5 - Review the course learning and set goals. Refine and perform a selection of repertoire.

Students can come for one or two weeks.
